

# Collaboration is key to university enrollment strategy

#### Dear colleagues:

Thank you for your continued support of and partnership with Ohio State's office of Strategic Enrollment Management. I am pleased to share with you the 2023 university Enrollment Report.

The data contained in this report tells a success story — one of intentional collaboration among offices, colleges, schools, faculty and students. All of us worked together to reimagine enrollment to support the student lifecycle, from recruitment all the way to graduation. Our teams are focused on student access, affordability, completion and career success. I am pleased to report our enrollment is strong.



#### Some of this year's key highlights include:

- The first-year retention rate on the Columbus campus increased to 94.2%.
- Total enrollment on **Ohio State's regional campuses and ATI grew for the first time in five years**, despite national trends of declining regional campus enrollment.
- All campuses saw an increase in new first-year students (NFYS):
  - Regional campuses and ATI: 14.7% increase
  - Columbus campus: 0.2% increase
- The average debt students graduated with decreased again for the sixth consecutive year.

I'm proud of our collective work this year and look forward to our continued collaboration to recruit, retain and graduate students who will excel in the workforce, provide leadership in all fields and contribute to solving the complex challenges of our world.



## TOTAL ENROLLMENT **BY RESIDENCY**, ALL LEVELS AND CAMPUSES







#### NUMBER OF **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**, ALL LEVELS AND CAMPUSES (10-YEAR TREND)






## ENROLLMENT **BY COUNTRY** OF CITIZENSHIP, ALL LEVELS AND CAMPUSES (TOP 14)

#### INITIATIVE

#### Buckeye Student Leadership Academy (BSLA)

BSLA serves as an initiative to improve Ohioan's access to higher education.

This program provides an opportunity for high-achieving Ohio high school students to experience an intensive taste of college life through in-person and virtual programing. Students apply for the program in their junior year and attend the following June through November. During the program, students learned more about themselves, leadership, the college experience and resources to support their success.

The first-year cohort consisted of 46 students representing 35 high schools. 98% of BSLA students were admitted in AU23.


#### NFYS TOTAL ENROLLMENT

#### **STARS Network**

In 2023, Ohio State joined a group of 16 other colleges and universities in the Small Town and Rural Students (STARS) Network. As a member of the network, which is supported by a \$20 million grant, Ohio State will prepare academically talented, rural, firstgeneration undergraduate students across Ohio for success in work and life with free resources, like college counseling and financial workshops. Our initial focus in autumn 2024 will be on Ohio's 32 Appalachian counties.



#### UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

Despite a national trend of fewer college-bound students, Ohio State's undergraduate enrollment remained steady — pointing to our excellent national reputation and the understood value of an Ohio State degree. Our first-year retention rate also continues to be strong, increasing this year to one of the university's highest.

The academic colleges are key partners in our ability to recruit, retain and graduate students. Strategic Enrollment Management continues to work collaboratively with each college to develop enrollment strategies designed to meet the unique needs of our colleges.

Through the work of the College Outreach Group and guided by the SEM vice provost and college deans, we continue to build strong plans.

#### **INITIATIVE**

#### **Buckeye Agricultural Leadership Program**

Launched as a pilot in 2022 as a collaboration between Strategic Enrollment Management and the College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CFAES), this program focused on new first-year students applying for 2023. Buckeye Agricultural Leadership Program (BALP) provided information to students, parents, teachers, school counselors and industry professionals — especially in rural and urban communities — about the application process and the merits of pursing a degree offered by CFAES. By engaging earlier with students, families and those who support them, enrollment for students interested in targeted BALP majors increased by 42.5%; 26% for all agricultural programs.

#### NFYS COLUMBUS CAMPUS

Ohio State continues to attract new first-year students (NFYS) from across the state and nation. Enrollment of NFYS on the Columbus campus increased to 7,983 students (0.2%). These students continue to be a cademically talented: 96% are in the top 25% of their high school classes and 68%are in the top 10% of their high school classes. The number of new first-year minority students increased by nearly 11%, a record high.

# Regional campuses and Ohio State ATI

Our commitment to access for residents of the state of Ohio is enhanced by our four regional campuses in Lima, Mansfield, Marion and Newark, in addition to the College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CFAES) Wooster campus, which houses Ohio State ATI. In 2023, leaders from all six Ohio State campuses met and — using a "one-university" approach — developed strategies to increase yield on regional campuses. These efforts fueled a 14.7% increase in first-year student enrollments.


New first-year student enrollment for regionals and ATI increased 14.7% to 2,569 through renewed enrollment optimization efforts.

These campuses welcomed 685 (26.7%) underrepresented racial and ethnic minority students and 1,176 (45.8%) first-generation students.


#### **Enrollment turnaround plan**

In response to declines in college-going rates and projections of a demographic downturn impacting the regional campuses, we are finalizing the university's first regional campus enrollment turnaround plan, which considers all levers impacting enrollment on those campuses. The plan includes strategies around branding, community awareness, recruitment, financial aid optimization, retention and graduation, and is expected to continue our current momentum while ensuring long-term enrollment success.

# Student financial success

We continue the momentum of our efforts to make an Ohio State education more affordable for a greater number of students. Efforts include creating a Strategic Enrollment Management student financial success unit, increasing student support, coordinating operational improvements and making it easier for students to find and apply for scholarships. In collaboration with offices, colleges, faculty and students across the university, we're learning more about how students navigate financial aid, internships and scholarships.

#### INITIATIVE

#### ScholarshipUniverse

ScholarshipUniverse is an easy-to-use online scholarship-matching platform that helps students better search and apply for financial aid opportunities. We continue to expand the platform across the university and see a significant increase in student engagement and applications.

Most colleges and units already joined ScholarshipUniverse to manage donorfunded scholarships, with a goal to have the entire university in a single, unified system.

In the 2023-2024 aid year, 19,545 applications were submitted in ScholarshipUniverse by 10,377 Ohio State students (students can submit multiple applications within the tool).

#### **INITIATIVE**

#### **Financial Aid Optimization**

Financial Aid Optimization focuses on re-evaluating existing aid programs to increase effectiveness, reduce barriers for students, coordinate scholarship strategies with colleges and continue to reduce debt loads for all students. One immediate result for 2023-2024: an adjustment was made to the Buckeye Opportunity Program to allow regional campus students to qualify beginning their first semester of enrollment. The Buckeye Opportunity Program ensures that all eligible Ohio resident students who qualify for a Federal Pell Grant receive enough aid to cover the full cost of undergraduate tuition and mandatory fees.

# **Graduate and Professional**

Enrollment of graduate and professional non-residents increased to 6,314 (+1.6%) and new international graduate student enrollments returned to 2019 levels. The overall diversity of graduate students significantly increased over the past five years, from 16.7% in 2019 to 20.3% in 2023.



# Degree attainment and graduation


